

Preserving Human Voices and Faces by Pope Leo

For the 60th World Day of Social Communications, Pope Leo XIV reminds us that in a world shaped by digital media and artificial intelligence, we must never lose what is most human. He begins with a powerful truth: "Face and voice are unique traits of every person." They reveal who we are. Through our face and our voice, we meet one another, recognize, and build relationships. Communication is not only sharing of information; it is the sharing of life. The Holy Father warns that modern technology, though powerful and useful, can also weaken our humanity if it replaces real encounter. Artificial intelligence can assist us, but it must never take the place of the human heart, human conscience, or human responsibility. He writes that we should "not renounce your ability to think." In a digital world full of fast opinions, emotional reactions, and endless content, he calls us to preserve reflection, wisdom, and discernment. Communication must not manipulate emotions or simply seek attention. It must serve truth.
