WEEK OF PRAYER FOR
CHRISTIAN UNITY 2022



As the Pontifical Council for Promoting Christian Unity reminds us in their recent document, "Christians cannot despair in the face of Christian division [...] Christ has already defeated these evils." (The Bishop and Christian Unity, 42). While we continue to distance ourselves physically, it is all the more necessary to join together in prayer "that they may all be one" (John 17:21) just as Jesus Christ prayed.

Tuesday, January 18 marks the beginning of the annual Week of Prayer for Christian Unity, an eight day period celebrated internationally between the Feast of St. Peter's Chair and the Feast of the Conversion of St. Paul. It was first developed by Servant of God Father Paul Wattson, SA, at Graymoor in Garrison, New York, and was first observed at Graymoor from January 18-25, 1908.

This year, the theme selected by the Middle East Council of Churches is "We saw the star in the East, and we came to worship Him." (Matthew 2:2) In light of the daily struggles Christians face in the Middle East, this reference to the Epiphany reminds us all of God's invitation to the new covenant in the Incarnation of Jesus Christ and the hope we find in it.

LET US PRAY

O Lord God our Father, you sent the star to lead the Magi to your only begotten Son. Increase our hope in you and let us know at all times that you are walking with us, watching over your people.

Teach us to follow the guidance of your Holy Spirit, however strange the path may seem, so that we may be led to our unity in Jesus Christ, the light of the world. Open our eyes to your Spirit, and encourage us in our faith, so that we may confess that Jesus is Lord and worship and rejoice in him, as the Magi did in Bethlehem. We ask you these blessings in the name of your Son Jesus Christ. Amen
