The Easter Alleluia!

"Our thoughts in this present life should turn on the praise of God, because it is in praising God that we shall rejoice for ever in the life to come; and no one can be ready for the next life unless he trains himself for it now.



So we praise God during our earthly life, and at the same time we make our petitions to him. Our praise is expressed with joy, our petitions with yearning...Because there are two periods of time – the one that now is - with the trials and troubles of this life, and the other yet to come - a life of everlasting serenity and joy. We are given two liturgical seasons, one before Easter and the other after. The season before Easter signifies the troubles in which we live here and now, while the time after Easter which we are celebrating at present signifies the happiness that will be ours in the future. This is why we keep the first season with fasting and prayer; but now the fast is over and we devote the present season to praise. Such is the meaning of the *Alleluia* we sing... The Lord's passion depicts for us our present life of trial – shows how we must suffer and be afflicted and finally die... Now therefore, brethren, we urge you to praise God. That is what we are all telling each other when we say *Alleluia*. You say to your neighbour, "Praise the Lord!" and he says the same to you... But see that your praise comes from your whole being; in other words, see that you praise God not with your lips and voices alone, but with your minds, your lives and all your actions..."*From a discourse on the psalms by Saint Augustine, Bishop*
